MAY VIRTUAL CONFERENCE SUMMARY

 - Current Quarterly Report Form
 - Current Facility or Individual Report of Adverse Finding Form

- Separate standard-of-care determinations shall be made for each involved provider and each clinical issue reasonably presented by the facts.
- 2021 Hospital Survey Trends
 - Patient Rights citations
 - Infection Control/Prevention citations
- When are Risk Management Plans due? They are due 60 days prior to license renewal, preferably 60-90 days prior in case revisions are necessary.
- When are Quarterly Reports due? Within 30 days of each completed quarter.

> <u>TIPS:</u>

- If you have provider changes through the year, just send the 1 page with the changes on Medical Staff. Per Kelly you do not have to send the entire plan, if nothing else has changed.
- On an incident report, the expectation is that there is always something documented in response to actions taken. The reg (28-52-1(c)) states every incident investigation must include "findings, conclusions, recommendations, actions taken, and results of actions taken".

Signs and Symptoms:

Presentation from Megan Kelly DNP, RN on Kansas Nurse Assistance Program (KNAP)

KNAP is a professional assistance program designed to assist all nurses and mental health technicians in the state of Kansas who may have a problem or illness that has or could impair their ability to practice safely.

The most common cause of impairment is abuse of alcohol and/or drugs.

Top Substances of Abuse:

Alcohol Physical
Opioids, Hydrocodone, Oxycodone, Fentanyl Behavioral
Amphetamines, Adderall Practice Issues
Cocaine/Crack
Cannabis, Marijuana

Self-referrals to the program are encouraged, but referrals may be made by a family member, a friend, employer, supervisor, or anyone concerned about the nurse or LMHT.

<u>Reminder:</u> By making a report to KNAP satisfies our reporting requirement for impaired nurses. If you make a report to KNAP, you don't have to report to KSBN.


