Making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2023, June 30, 2024, and June 30, 2025, for the University of Kansas Medical Center; relating to conducting certain clinical trials at the midwest stem cell therapy center

Concerning the state children's health insurance program; relating to eligibility; updating income requirements therefore
