Hearing: Senate Bill 373 - Prohibits the use of public money for lobbying activities

Hearing: <u>Senate Bill 425</u> – Provides child support orders for unborn children from the date of conception

Final action: <u>House Bill 2353</u> – Increases the amount of time a person may be held for treatment and adds criteria for when continued treatment may be ordered under the Care and Treatment Act for mentally ill persons

Hearing: <u>House Bill 2645</u> – Amends the Nursing Service Scholarship Program to remove limits on the amount of awards and number of scholarships, removes the sponsorship requirement, modifies the interest rate terms for repayment obligations and abolishes the nursing service scholarship review

Hearing on <u>House Bill 2751</u>— Authorizes the Kansas Department for again and disability Services to condition or restrict a disability service provider license, granting the secretary authority to grant regulation waivers unrelated to health and safety and authorizes correction orders and civil fines to be appealed to the secretary.

<u>House Bill 2750</u> – Permits the use of expedited partner therapy to treat a sexually transmitted disease.

Final action: <u>House Bill 2484</u> – Enacts the Social Work Licensure Compact to provide interstate practice privileges for social workers

Hearing: <u>House Bill 2629</u> – Requires the secretary for the Kansas Department of Health and Environment to provide a death certificate of a child to the State Child Death Review Board, increases the number of board members, allows for compensation and provides for the disclosure of certain records to certain persons for securing grants

Hearing: <u>House Bill 2628</u> – Requires the secretary the Kansas Department for Children and Families to release certain information related to a child fatality when criminal charges are filed alleging that a person caused such fatality

<u>Senate Bill 487</u> – Concerning emergency communication services; relating to the Kansas 911 Act; authorizing counties to contract with other counties to share services of 911 public safety answering points; authorizing distributions of 911 fee money to counties for such purposes – By the Committee on Federal and State Affairs

<u>Senate Bill 488</u> – Concerning the attorney general; relating to the office of the inspector general and the powers, duties and responsibilities thereof; expanding the power of the inspector general to investigate and audit all state cash, food and health assistance programs – By the Committee on Public Health and Welfare

<u>House Bill 2776</u> – Concerning workers' compensation; relating to coverage under the act, notice, benefits, liability limitations, definitions, evidentiary standards, hearings, admission of evidence, procedures, settlements and other matters; providing coverage for members of the Kansas National Guard under the Workers' Compensation Act – By the Committee on Commerce, Labor and Economic Development, Requested by Rep. Clayton

House Bill 2777 – Concerning health and health care; relating to patient care facilities; prohibiting the state fire marshal and the marshal's representatives from wearing or operating a body camera during an onsite inspection at a patient care facility – By the Committee on Health and Human Services, Requested by Rep. Bergquist on behalf of Rep. Landwehr

<u>House Bill 2778</u> – Concerning health and health care; relating to dieticians; enacting the Dietician Compact to provide interstate practice privileges – By the Committee on Health and Human Services, Requested by Rep. S. Ruiz on behalf of the Board of Dieticians

<u>House Bill 2779</u> – Concerning health professions and practices; related to optometry; modifying certain provisions of the optometry law related to scope of practice, definitions and credentialing requirements – By the Committee on Health and Human Services, Requested by Rep. Buehler on behalf of the Kansas Optometric Association

<u>House Bill 2784</u> – Concerning adult care homes; relating to continuing care retirement communities; transferring authority for certification of such facilities from the Kansas Insurance Department to the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services; lowering the nursing facility provider assessment for such facilities – By the Committee on Health and Human Services, Requested by Rep. Landwehr
