Clarification on Reimbursement for Holds Waiting for State Hospital Admissions

The Kansas Hospital Association has received an important clarification related to reimbursement to hospitals for round-the-clock <u>patient observation</u> and <u>transportation</u> costs for patient admissions to state mental hospitals.

- KDADS will allow reimbursement for both voluntary and involuntary admissions (with or without insurance).
- KDADS will allow reimbursement for not only Osawatomie State Hospital and Larned State Hospital, but any admission to State Institution Alternative settings. Those facilities include:
 - Cottonwood Springs, Olathe
 - o Camber (KVC Hospitals) Kansas City, Kansas City
 - Camber (KVC Hospitals) Wichita, Wichita
 - o Newton Medical Center (NMC), Newton
 - o Prairie View, Inc., Newton
 - o Ascension Via Christi Hospital, Wichita
 - o Anew Health (Began accepting patients 6/21/2022), Shawnee
 - o Hutchinson Regional Medical Center (In the enrollment process), Hutchinson
- KDADS will allow you to submit reimbursement for any of these costs from July 1, 2023, to present.

The reimbursement form can be found by visiting <u>KDADS Form for Involuntary Patients</u>. You may view the website and get all the information by visiting <u>State Hospitals (ks.gov)</u>.

Hospitals seeking reimbursement will need to be registered as a vendor in the state's SMART accounting system. To become enrolled, you must fill out the $\underline{DA-130}$ and $\underline{W-9}$ form payment.

Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program Application Period Now Live

The Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program is now accepting applications for 2024. This program offers loan repayment assistance to registered nurses, nurse practitioners, advanced practice nurses and nursing school faculty who agree to work in a Health Profession Shortage Area facility or an eligible school of nursing for at least two years.

This program will pay 60 percent of a nurse's educational loan balance in exchange for a two-year minimum work commitment in a HPSA. Preference is given to nurses based on the greatest financial need and their specialty and/or facility type where employed. Nurses working in counties with higher HPSA scores also will also be given priority. The deadline to apply is Mar. 7, 2024. Click here for more information and/or to apply.

Regulatory Requirements Related to Health Equity & Social Determinants of Health

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services requires all hospitals to comply with reporting on health equity commitment and social determinants of health screenings. There are three measures required:

- Hospital Commitment to Health Equity
- Screening for Social Determinants of Health
- Screen Positive for Social Determinants of Health

The measures were required in the CMS Inpatient Prospective Payment System Final Rule for CY 2023 and is mandatory as part of the 2023 <u>Inpatient Quality Reporting</u> requirements. For Critical Access Hospitals, CMS has included this measure in the <u>Medicare Beneficiary Quality Improvement Project 2025 Measure Core Set</u>. Additionally, hospitals participating in the CMS Funded Hospital Quality Improvement Contractor Project have attested to Health Equity Organizational Assessment since the inception of the HQIC four years ago.

To help hospitals educate team members and their boards, the Kansas Healthcare Collaborative and Kansas Hospital Association have developed a health-equity requirements fact health-equity and social determinants of health-resources may be found on the KHA website, as well as a health-equity resource hub developed by multiple Kansas partners.

Kansas Health Foundation Announces Think Tank

The Kansas Health Foundation is creating an advisory "think tank" to spur critical thinking, innovation and creativity. Federal Rule Updates Opioid Treatment Programs

The <u>final rule</u> updating certain provisions of regulations related to Opioid Treatment Program accreditation, certification and standards for the treatment of Opioid Use Disorder with Medications for Opioid Use Disorder in OTPs was released Jan. 31 by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration. Changes to the regulation include making flexibilities put forth during the COVID-19 public health emergency permanent, as well as expanding access to care and evidence-based treatment for OUD. The final rule also removes all language and rules pertaining to the Drug Addiction and Treatment Act Waiver from the regulations pursuant to the "Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023."

Methadone will still only be available through a limited number of roughly 2,000 federally approved opioid treatment programs nationwide. However, patients accessing those clinics will now be able to receive more take-home doses of methadone. Other changes include the ability of an OTP to prescribe medication for OUD via telehealth without an initial in-person physical evaluation and the removal of certain requirements for admission to an OTP to better align with evidence-based practice.

The final rule repealed the treatment regulations enforced by the Food and Drug Administration and created a new regulatory system based on an accreditation model. In addition, the final rule shifted administrative responsibility and oversight from the FDA to SAMHSA. According to the federal administration, the new actions will take effect within six months.

CMS Promoting Interoperability and NHSN Reporting

Beginning in 2024, reporting to the National Healthcare Safety Network Antimicrobial Use and Resistance Module is required under the Public Health and Clinical Data Exchange objective of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Promoting Interoperability Program. Eligible hospitals and Critical Access Hospitals are required to be in active engagement with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to report both AU and Antimicrobial Resistance data. Facilities will receive a report from NHSN indicating their successful submission of AUR data for the EHR reporting period or claim an applicable exclusion.

The NHSN Team is hosting an Office Hours session from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, Mar. 7. The session will begin with a brief presentation. The remainder of the hour will be used for questions and answers with attendees.

Federal and National News

CMS Releases CY 2024 OPPS and ASC Correction Notice

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services <u>released</u> a correction notice to the calendar year 2024 Medicare Hospital Outpatient Prospective Payment System and Ambulatory Surgery Center final payment and policy updates.

CMS Refreshes Care Compare, Provider Data Catalog Data

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Care Compare website provides consumers with information on more than 100 quality measures for more than 4,000 hospitals nationwide. CMS recently updated data on the <u>Care Compare</u> and <u>Provider Data Catalog</u> websites. <u>Additional information</u> is available.

CMS Issues Guidance for Organ Procurement Organizations

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services <u>issued</u> revised guidance on Organ Procurement Organization Conditions for Coverage related to the use of the pancreata for islet cell research. The guidance is effective immediately and could impact quality reporting requirements.

CMS Releases IPFQR Specifications Manual Version 1.1c

Now available on <u>QualityNet</u> is version 1.1c of the Inpatient Psychiatric Facility specifications manual, effective for discharges beginning Jan. 1, 2023. Updates are outlined in the associated release notes and include changes to the index table of data elements to reflect the removal of the HBIPS-5 and TOB 2/2a measures from the IPFQR Program, clarified guidance for the TR-1 measures and additional guidance related to the abstraction of the sex data element.

CMS Selects Targeted Hospitals for FY 2026 Validation

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services selected the targeted sample of hospitals for data validation of measures within the Hospital Hospital Inpatient Quality Reporting Program and the Hospital-Acquired Condition Reduction Program for the fiscal year 2026 payment determination/program year. The quarters included in the data validation efforts for FY 2026 are the first quarter of 2023, the second quarter of 2023, the third quarter of 2023 and the fourth quarter of 2023. Additional information is available.

Selected hospitals will receive a direct email from the CMS Value, Incentives and Quality Reporting Validation Support Contractor. The updated list of hospitals selected for FY 2026 validation, as well as validation resources, can be found on QualityNet.

A CMS webinar to discuss the inpatient data validation process is scheduled at 1:00 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 15. Registration is required.

CMS Updates 2024 Medicare Advantage Program and Part D Payment Policies

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services <u>released</u> the Medicare Advantage and Part D Rate <u>announcement</u> for calendar year 2025. CMS <u>estimates</u> that MA plans will receive an increase of 3.7 percent from 2024 to 2025, amounting to approximately \$16 billion. CMS provided redesign program <u>instructions</u> as <u>prescribed</u> by the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 related to the new Manufacturer Discount Program.

CMS Reminds Hospitals of eCQM Reporting Deadlines

The deadline for hospitals participating in the Hospital Inpatient Quality Reporting Program and/or Medicare Promoting Interoperability Programs to submit calendar year 2023 electronic clinical quality measure data is Thursday, Feb. 29. Each quarter must contain at least three self-selected eCQMs, plus the mandatory Safe Use of Opioids-Concurrent Prescribing eCQM. The eCQMs must be the same across quarters. To meet CMS CY 2023 eCQM reporting requirements, report the Safe Use of Opioids-Concurrent Prescribing eCQM and at least three eCQMs from the CY 2023 Available eCQMs Table, for four quarters, using HER technology certified to the 2015 Edition Cures Update criteria. The Medicare Promoting Interoperability Program requirements and attestation deadline for eligible hospitals and critical access hospitals also is Thursday, Feb. 29.
