## President's Perspective – We Put Our Hearts into It

The Kansas Hospital Association soft-launched the public perception campaign, "We put our hearts into it," on Valentine's Day. The statewide campaign, now running, has a goal to improve the public perception of health care in Kansas and Kansas hospitals.

The campaign has two target audiences. The umbrella campaign counters negative perceptions about health care with positive messages and targets adults 35+. A subset of this campaign leverages message testing to help Kansas hospitals better position career opportunities within their communities. These assets target high school students (14-17), college students (18-22) and young adults (23-34).

Based on the public opinion poll and message testing conducted in 2023, KHA has developed several key messages for Kansas hospitals and health systems that better position the industry and improve public perceptions of Kansas health care; and relay the rewards of health care careers within Kansas communities.

The KHA Communications Committee suggested and reviewed resources for members to launch local public perception campaigns to complement the statewide efforts. Key messages, photos, videos, storyboards, social posts and scripts have now been added to a <a href="mailto:share-eff-share-ef

The new <u>shared folder</u> includes ready-to-go resources, as well as all the building blocks to build and customize your own communication pieces. We encourage KHA members to showcase their staff in this campaign, as Kansans have strong support and trust in their local health care professionals. We also have provided tips and instructions to help members maximize the messages that are compelling and believable.

KHA statewide campaign efforts will be in paid media on Facebook, Instagram and Snapchat. Ads will run for at least three months. We know there is a lot to love about Kansas health care, and we hope these new resources can help you showcase your staff and highlight how we "put our hearts into it." Register Now for the U.S. Drug Supply Chain Security Act Requirements Webinar – Mar. 28

The U.S. Drug Supply Chain Security Act, signed into law in 2013, is designed to track and trace prescription drugs distributed in the U.S. from the manufacturer to the point of dispensing to the patient. In August 2023, the Food and Drug Administration announced a one-year "stabilization period" for DSCSA requirements that became effective Nov. 27, 2023. The FDA stabilization period was intended to accommodate the additional time needed to comply with DSCSA requirements. The FDA will begin enforcing the DSCSA in November 2024.

### **Federal and National News**

## **President Proposes Fiscal Year 2025 Budget**

President Joe Biden <u>released</u> a proposed <u>budget</u> for fiscal year 2025. Although the president's budget is likely dead on arrival, it includes notable information that may guide regulating agency actions in 2025. The budget includes total receipts of \$5.485 trillion and total outlays of \$6.135 trillion for a deficit of \$1.694 trillion. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' <u>requested</u> budget includes a request of \$1.6 trillion in discretionary and mandatory funding for the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services during FY 2025.

### 8th Circuit Upholds Arkansas 340B Protections

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit <u>upheld</u> an Arkansas law granting protections for hospitals and other entities participating in the 340B program. The Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America claimed the law, which prohibited drug manufacturers from restricting the use of contract pharmacies, was preempted by the federal 340B statute. The court ruled that the Arkansas statute was harmonious with federal law.

#### **NHSC Scholarship Program Accepting Applications**

Health professional students studying to become physicians, dentists, nurse practitioners, nurse midwives or physician assistants can apply for the <u>National Health Service Corps Scholarship Program</u>. Recipients of the scholarship agree to provide service commitment in an underserved community for each year of scholarship support received. There is a two-year minimum service commitment, and participants can receive a maximum of four years of support. <u>Applications</u> are due by 6:30 p.m. Thursday, Apr. 25.

# **Congress Enacts Medicaid DSH Payment Cut Delays and Medicare Extenders**

Congress <u>enacted</u> the Consolidated Appropriations Act (HR 4366), which included a health care minibus package. The <u>law</u> delays the Medicaid disproportionate share hospital payment reductions, extends the Medicare-dependent Hospital program and extends the enhanced Medicare low-volume payment adjustment through the end of 2024. The bill also reduces the Medicare physician fee schedule payment reductions for CY 2024. The minibus did not include site-neutrality payment adjustments, or the requirement to obtain and bill using an NPI for all off-campus outpatient provider-based departments.

### CMS Issues Statement About Change Healthcare Cybersecurity Attack

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services continues to monitor and assess the impact of the Change Healthcare cyberattack that occurred in late February. CMS <u>announced</u> that "in addition to considering applications for accelerated payments for Medicare Part A providers, we will also be considering applications for advance payments for Part B suppliers." CMS released a <u>fact sheet</u> with additional information. Providers who use WPS as the MAC will need to request the Medicare advanced payment using a <u>questionnaire</u> and request form.

### **CMS Issues Revised Guidelines for CMHCs**

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services issued revised <u>guidelines</u> for Community Mental Health Centers. The agency updated the State Operations Manual-Appendix F to reflect changes made in the <u>Hospital Outpatient Prospective Payment System final rule</u> released in November 2023. Among other requirements, intensive outpatient services were added as a new level of care.

#### **CMS Issues Final Guidance on Medicare Prescription Payment Plan**

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services <u>released</u> a final <u>part one guidance</u> for the new Medicare Prescription Payment Plan. The guidance addresses topics such as identifying Medicare Part D enrollees who are likely to benefit from the program, the opt-in process, program participant protections and the data collection needed to evaluate the program. The guidance requires pharmacies to provide information about the program for anyone who meets a \$600 out-of-pocket threshold based on a single prescription at the point-of-sale. Medicare Part D enrollees will be able to opt into the <u>new program</u> for the <u>2025 plan year</u>.
