Financial Awareness Campaign Focuses on Commercial Payers

This year, the Kansas Hospital Association has been working broadly to tell the hospital finance story. KHA started these efforts with our annual campaign around <u>economic impact</u>, followed by our updated <u>financial infographic</u> highlighting Kansas hospitals' overall financial challenges. We then launched a one page infographic on <u>Medicaid</u>, followed by a one page infographic on <u>Medicare</u>.

This week, KHA is sharing with our members the next area of focus for our <u>Financial Awareness</u> <u>Campaign: Commercial Payers</u>. We hope this new infographic focusing on the impact of commercial payers will help our members kick-start education and conversation about commercial payers. According to a study conducted by PYA, a correlation can be formed between financial losses in Kansas hospitals compared to hospital payments received by Kansas' dominant commercial payers.

Next week, KHA will publicly release the full study in addition to pursuing interviews and earned media. KHA will follow up with public education through statewide social media. We encourage our members to have local conversations on the findings in this report as well as the impacts commercial payers, Medicare and Medicaid have on your hospital finances and the ability to provide care in your community.

Resources to help our members tell the story about health care finance are available in Box.com. It includes print resources in this campaign, template social media posts and other communications tools. In a nutshell, ongoing trends with Kansas commercial payers have left Kansas hospitals with less money to fill the gap in what Medicare, Medicaid, underinsured and uninsured patients do not pay for the cost of their care.

We hope all these tools will help hospitals to have meaningful conversations about financial challenges and make positive changes. Nominate Individuals Making a Difference by June 1

We know many individuals in Kansas are instrumental in making a difference for hospitals in Kansas and the health care they provide in our communities. Whether these individuals work in a hospital or outside our ranks, the Kansas Hospital Association wants to recognize their efforts. To honor those who have gone above and beyond the call of duty, we need you to let us know who they are by nominating them by June 1. KHA members are encouraged to make nominations in our <u>online awards portal</u> for the following awards:

<u>Charles S. Billings Award</u> – The award recognizes a hospital leader for his or her lifetime of service and continuing contribution to the health care of Kansas. This is the top honor given by KHA. This award was established in 1971 to honor KHA's first president, Charles. S. Billings' dedication and years of service to Kansans.

<u>Distinguished Health Care Advocate Award</u> – The award honors individuals, organizations or groups that have demonstrated their commitment to health care through participation in the public domain. This award gives members of KHA the opportunity to recognize those who work on our behalf from outside our ranks.

<u>Donald A. Wilson Visionary Award</u> – The award recognizes hospital-related individuals who have made outstanding, innovative contributions to health care delivery, health care financing or initiatives that improve the health and clinical outcomes of their community. This award was established in 2007 to honor long-time KHA president and CEO Donald A. Wilson's dedication and years of service to Kansans.

<u>Trustee of the Year Award</u> – The award recognizes and honors a hospital board member from each facility who is a leader, gives back to the community and routinely goes beyond the call of duty. KHA members are encouraged to recognize a trustee who has served with distinction and made significant contributions to the betterment of their hospital and community.

<u>Heart of Health Care Award</u> – The award recognizes and honors the excellence of health care workers statewide. Previously, this award was called the Health Care Worker of the Year Award. All nominated employees (one employee from every hospital) will be recognized by KHA for making a significant contribution to the betterment of their hospital.

<u>Workforce Strategies Award</u> – The award recognizes a team of employees, providers or volunteers who worked collaboratively to make a significant contribution to the well-being, retention or recruitment of health care workers at their facility(s) or in Kansas.

Last week, the American Hospital Association <u>presented its highest honor</u>, the Distinguished Service Award, to Melinda Estes, MD, the former president and CEO of Saint Luke's Health System based in Kansas City, MO. Estes received the 2025 award during a ceremony held May 5 at the AHA Annual Membership Meeting in Washington, DC.

Measles Update and FAQs Issued by KDHE

According to a Kansas Health Alert Network Alert issued May 12, the Kansas Department of Health and Environment is reporting 51 cases of measles across the state; 49 cases associated with the ongoing outbreak in eight counties in southwest Kansas and two cases thought to be related to international travel in Sedgwick and Reno counties. Most cases continue to present among unvaccinated children. KDHE advises in the HAN, because of the highly contagious nature of measles, additional cases are likely to occur in the outbreak area in Kansas and in surrounding counties, especially among those who are unvaccinated.
