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Project ECHO as a Tool to Address the Opioid Epidemic

Project ECHO is a collaborative model to increase sharing and workforce capacity to provide best-practice care and reduce health disparities. Learn how three different organizations in the Great Plains QIN region have utilized Project ECHO to address aspects of the opioid epidemic including pain management, medication assisted treatment, and screening and care for opioid use disorder.
