Adaptive Leadership Training for Administrative and Physician/Clinical Leaders

Sept. 18-19, 2025

Homewood Suites at the Waterfront Wichita, KS

OVERVIEW

This training was developed in partnership with the Kansas Leadership Center, with guidance from the Kansas Hospital Association's Hospital Physician Leadership Committee. This committee is comprised of hospital CEOs and physician leaders from across Kansas. They develop strategies and resources to improve hospital leadership and physician/clinician alignment while working together to address increasingly complex challenges.

KLC faculty will provide a 1.5 day in-person Foundations of Leadership Program exclusively for Kansas Hospital Association participants. This program introduces the KLC framework and highlights competencies and principles within the framework such as: the difference between technical problems and adaptive challenges, the distinction between leadership and authority, making tough interpretations, working across factions, asking powerful questions, managing the heat in any system, creating a trustworthy process, and making leadership less risky for others. These concepts will be taught within the context of a specific case or challenge that exists within health care, developed by selected stakeholders prior to the program with guidance from the KLC teacher. The case will anchor the conversations and provide participants live opportunities throughout the program to apply the KLC leadership framework to the case study.

By the end of this program, participants will:

- Shift from a primarily technical mindset to a technical and adaptive mindset;
- Use KLC's leadership framework to diagnose the gap between concerns and aspirations;
- Apply KLC's adaptive skills and tools to a real world challenge(s); and
- Help individuals see new opportunities, seize these opportunities and solve problems faster.

This training is designed for a team of an administrative leader and physician/clinical leader from the same hospital/health system or clinic - to attend together. Individual participants are also welcome.

Space for this interactive training will be limited to 50 total participants.

FACULTY

Kevin Bomhoff Is a founding member of KLC's core teaching team. His background includes training and coaching with businesses; facilitating strategic planning with nonprofits, governments, coalitions, and hospitals; and providing technical assistance to communities developing healthy living policies and practices.
